Last Thursday, many of our students experienced a significant spiritual milestone, receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time. It was a reverent and joyful occasion in the church, beautifully guided by Father Jim and Father Jude. Our thanks go to them, as well as to Joel Kearney, our Religious Education Leader, and the Year 3/4 teachers—Leonie Cann, Hunter Merryful, and Kellie Barbour—who prepared our students with great care and spiritual guidance.

As we begin preparations for 2025, we are taking steps to sustainably manage our resources. We have some excess furniture that we hope to save from landfill.
